Praying for a Permanent and Lasting Ceasefire



The United Church of Canada joins in the prayers and hopes of partners in Palestine and Israel and around the world at news of the emerging ceasefire agreement between Israel and Hamas. We reiterate our call for the immediate and safe release of all captives
