# UCC 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary - Did you Know??

- The first recorded Christian service in Swift Current was conducted by Rev. George Lloyd in April 1885. He was a priest of the Anglican Church of Canada. Most of the parishioners were soldiers under Colonel Otter's command.
  - Knox Presbyterian Church on North Railway was built in 1889.
  - As the Knox congregation grew, it was evident that a larger church was necessary. Four 50 foot lots at the corner of Chaplin and 3<sup>rd</sup> Ave NE were purchased. Contracts were awarded in 1912 to build a \$25,000 church and a \$3000 manse. The organ was purchased and installed at a cost of \$6000.
     120 families were now in the congregation.

## **Summer Meal Program**

The Social Conveners and Outreach Committee are participating in the Summer Meal Program as it enters its 3rd year through the coordination of Swift Link.

We are providing **30 family-sized meals and a minimum of 15 dozen muffins** to cover one full week of nourishment to families that are having a difficult time.

The meals are being made in mid-April and frozen.

They will be distributed through the Family Resource Centre the first week of July. We are asking the congregation for **monetary donations** (receipts provided) to help cover the cost of the groceries and fresh fruit.

We are also asking for volunteers to bake muffins.

You can donate by cash, cheque or through e-transfer through the church office.

Thank you for helping us feed hungry children in our community.
